

## Soprano, Alto, and Tenor Choral Scholar Openings

## Positions available for 2022-2023 church year

The **First Unitarian Society of Milwaukee** is currently accepting applications for **Soprano, Alto, and Tenor Choral Scholar** positions in our church. This paid internship commences on August 25<sup>th</sup>, 2022 and is designed to provide collegiate Music students the opportunity to gain performance experience in a liberal religious setting.

**Choral Scholars** sing with the First Unitarian Chancel Choir for rehearsals on Thursdays from 7:15 to 9:00 p.m. and for Sunday services when the choir is scheduled, typically about once a month between September and early June, plus one service on Christmas Eve. Sunday duties include warm-up/rehearsal at 8:15 a.m. and two church services at 9:00 and 11:00 a.m. Rehearsals start mid-August and end at the beginning of June. There may also be opportunities for Scholars to perform solos or in small groups for additional pay.

Choral Scholars are compensated \$30 for each Thursday rehearsal and each Sunday service. We have openings in the Soprano, Alto, and Tenor section for the 2022-2023 church year.

A Unitarian Universalist congregation, the First Unitarian Society of Milwaukee affirms Music as a vitally important spiritual resource. Just as we can learn from Jesus, Buddha, and Mohammed, so too can we learn from J.S. Bach, John Coltrane, and Joan Baez. Indeed, our Sunday services are filled with music as varied as the beliefs of our congregation.

Select candidates will be contacted to schedule an audition, which will consist of the following:

- Two contrasting vocal solos of your choice, no more than 2 min. each. (Accompanist will be provided)
- Sight-singing choral harmony
- Short interview
